
THEOLOGICAL DEFINITIONS



02. "Redemption" "Release from captivity by payment of a ransom"

(Hebrews 9:12 NKJV) "Not with the blood of goats and calves, but with His own blood He entered the Most Holy Place once for all, having obtained eternal redemption."

When you give your heart to Jesus, the debt against you is not simply canceled, but is fully paid. Christ's blood (or His life), which he surrendered at the cross, is the "ransom" He paid, to deliver you from slavery to sin, and its eternal consequences.



Christ's sacrifice through His death on the cross redeemed us or bought us back from our enslaved condition. We now have a new and loving Master, the Lord Jesus Christ, who has gives us the free gift of eternal life. Ask His forgiveness today. Let Him be Lord and Savior of your life!
