### 08. "Sin"

## "Breaking or transgressing the divine law of God"

"Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness." (1 John 3:4 NKJV)

Sin is lawlessness in the eyes of God. He alone is our moral Governor and Judge. Sin is always, by its nature, vile and polluting. It is anything that offends the holiness of God and is justly deserving of punishment.

With the exception of Jesus Christ, no man or woman has lived without sin. Scripture is very clear on this issue. The sin nature is in constant battle with the new nature.

"For there is not a just man on earth who does good and does not sin." (Ecclesiastes 7:20 NKJV)

"As it is written: "There is none righteous, no, not one;" (Romans 3:10 NKJV)

#### Kinds of Sin

- 1. Presumption
  Willfully premeditated, defiant rebellion against God
- 2. Ignorance
  Unconsciously committed sin (Psalm 19:12)
- 3. Commission

  Does not intend to do evil does not come from an insolent attitude. It is, however a deliberate act
- Omission
   Failing (omitting) to do what is right.
